




THE HISTORY

A City of Naples Landmark For 134 Years


- · Originally built in 1888, an essential piece of Naples development
- Rebuilt after the hurricanes of 1910, 1926, 1944 & 1960
- Gateway to Naples until arrival of train service at Naples Depo in 1927





THE HISTORY

- Old lower dock, used at low tide, to access ferry boats to and from Fort Myers
- In the 1950's, a submarine moored at the pier allowing locals a submarine tour

2017 HURRICANE IRMA

THA oversaw the construction to fix the damage to the wooden structures



RECENT PILING REPAIRS

Following hurricane Irma repairs, THA has worked with the City of Naples to implement repairs to the concrete piles and bents.



Old concrete encased pilings




New piles encased in modern pile jackets

- Minor damage to shower area




Side scan image of submerged pier



Current condition of concession area






Can the pier be repaired?


Your request for authorization under emergency permitting procedures was received on November 22, 2022. Your proposal involves reconstruction of a 12,410 square foot municipal fishing pier in its previous configuration, including installation of 230, 14-inch concrete pillings by jetting. Previous reconstruction of the fishing pier was authorized under Corps permit number 199405286(LOP-SA), issued on December 14, 1994. Turbidity curtains shall be used throughout construction to prevent sedimentation of the adjacent waterbody.

The project would affect waters of the United States associated with the Gulf of Mexico at 25 12th Avenue South, Section 9, Township 50 South, Range 25 East, Naples, Collier County, Florida (Latitude: 26.131561°; Longitude: -81.80757°). The proposed activities are authorized under approved emergency permitting procedures in accordance with the terms and conditions specified below.

- You are authorized to undertake the activity described above pursuant to Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 U.S.C. § 403).
- 2. The proposed activities are authorized by Nationwide Permit (NWP) 3 (Maintenance). - Less steps




CONCESSION AREA
